We, as a club, a community, a family, are redefining what it means to have a disability. Treasurer's Comments

Financial Reporting

BlowFly Cricket remains classified as a Tier 2 association which is required to submit a summary of our financial affairs to the members at the Annual General Meeting (AGM). Tier 2 associations must lodge annual financial summaries in the approved form with the Director-General, NSW Government Fair Trading, within one month after the AGM.

Tier 2 associations must ensure their financial records correctly explain their financial transactions and financial position. Tier 2 associations are those whose:

- total revenue as recorded in the income and expenditure statement (i.e., gross receipts) for a financial year is \$250,000 or less, and
- current assets are \$500,000 or less.

From the 2023–24 income year, non-charitable not-for-profits (NFP) with an active ABN need to lodge an annual return. The annual reporting requirement is designed to enhance transparency and integrity in the system, by ensuring only eligible NFPs access income tax exemption. This measure was announced by the Federal Government on 11 May 2021, with the first NFP self-review return required for the 2023–24 income year. The NFP self-review return was due by 31 October, which BlowFly Cricket complied.

Furthermore, it is now the opportune time for BlowFly Cricket to go down the path of Applying for Charity Registration with the ACNC as a Public Benevolent Institution. This will be further documented in the "2025 – Year in Review" Report.

With a continuation of astute management BlowFly Cricket continues in a strong and viable financial position. Our funding is through a number of 'volunteer driven' fundraising initiatives, assorted grants, donations and sponsorship including the generous support of many local businesses who have a keen and active interest in the ongoing development of BlowFly Cricket.





Changing the game for people living with special needs with BlowFly Cricket - The Centre for Volunteering

Young Volunteers







Introduction

BlowFly Cricket is an organisation that helps people living with an intellectual disability have fun, get to know each or build up strong bonds. Hence the name, it's primarily focused around playing cricket with the sessions being held at James Henty Drive Oval, Dural on Friday evenings, as well as James Park, Hornsby on Saturday afternoons. There, friendly volunteers will setup the cricket equipment, prepare food and make sure that everyone's fine and well and having a wonderful time.

We also have monthly barbecues at Thornleigh Bunnings Warehouse where we sell sausages, drinks and sometimes tell people about who we are and what we do.

My Time and Perspective as a Volunteer

So far, I've been volunteering for BlowFly Cricket for around 2 years and my time has been incredible. To me, these are no ordinary cricket sessions and are extra special to our members as they have fun and feel great when playing, chatting with others or watching. We make sure that everyone gets to have a fair say if they need to, enjoy themselves and are all equal to each other which is why I more than agree this to be extraordinary.

As soon as I arrive, my day starts off with other members greeting me, asking how my day was and other things like that which immediately puts a smile on my face and makes me happy. The rest of the day for me usually plays out with getting to know each other's lives, what we've been up to, chatting, playing cricket excitedly and having an absolutely wonderful time.

I've also enjoyed the other experiences I've had at BlowFly Cricket such as cooking sausages on the barbecue, getting help and an inside on techniques such as bowling a ball or the strategy to bat the ball properly and using those to improve and get better over time each session.



Needless to say, wedding planning has been in full swing, and I've taken the role of clueless but enthusiastic Groom to be.





Coffs Kids Enjoy All-Abilities Coaching Clinic







EVERYONE should have the chance to experience the thrill of playing sport. And Sydney's BlowFly Cricket Club have provided this opportunity for a group of Coffs Coast children, with the club traveling to host an allabilities coaching clinic at Bray Street Oval.

A group of seven children aged between 6 and 13 took part in the clinic, with the three girls and four boys from the organisation Coffs Kids in Motion. Having never played cricket before, by the end of the afternoon they simply could not get enough of the sport.

BlowFly Cricket Club founder Mark Rushton said it was a special moment for the kids to take part in the clinic. "It was an amazing experience for them," he said.

"Through this clinic, we not only helped the children play and love cricket, but also helped them be more independent and responsible and created social interaction opportunities for them."

The all-abilities programs at the Sydney club were started by Mark a few years ago to prove a point. He was told once that people with disabilities were 'uncoachable' to play sport and coach sport, and he set out to prove them wrong with his 'Coach the Uncoachables' program.

The program is an officially recognised Level 1 coaching course for people living with a disability so that they can be accredited and therefore earn money through coaching. Cricket NSW's North Coast Cricket Manager, Kate Jackson arranged for equipment kits and giveaway Woolworths Cricket Blast showbags that the children were thrilled to receive.

The children were also given engraved 'Blowies' medals from the club, which were a hit too, and nicely topped off the afternoon's activities.

Cricket NSW is looking to create more all abilities programs across the state and will use the expertise from existing programs like BlowFly Cricket. Julie Stafford, Female Engagement and D&I Manager, Cricket NSW, praised BlowFly Cricket Club's commitment to providing all-abilities coaching clinics. "Cricket is a sport for all, and we love the expertise and guidance the BlowFly Cricket Club coaches bring to our all-abilities programs," she said,

"We are looking to roll out new Cricket NSW all-abilities programs this season in new locations."

Specialist Paediatric Physiotherapist, Kay Joseph, of Coffs Kids in Motion, has long seen the need to run group physical activity sessions for children with additional needs. When Exercise Physiologist, Alex Bruggisser, joined her team, it gave her the opportunity to fulfill this dream.

Coffs Kids in Motion now run sport-specific group sessions each school holidays. With Summer approaching, Alex suggested Cricket might now be appropriate.

Kay initially had some reservations about how Cricket drills and skills could be adapted to suit the kids she works with but gave Alex the thumbs up to pursue the idea.

It didn't take Alex long to find out about BlowFly Cricket and connect with Mark Rushton. When she rang to pick his brain about resources, she was overwhelmed and thrilled when he offered to bring coaches up to Coffs to run a session. On the day, power chairs, support workers and parents were left for dead as the Uncoachables enthusiastically introduced a group of 7 kids to Cricket. Throwing, bowling, batting and teamwork were the order of the day with a game and medal ceremony the highlight that finished things off! It wasn't only the development of cricket skills that made this such an incredible experience for these kids!

As well as a taste for the sport, therapeutically there were remarkable advances in social skills, trust and relationship development which several weeks later, are still evident! Hopefully we are pre-skilling some kids so that they can one day integrate into community-based cricket.

We hope the tour was just as rewarding for the Uncoachables and that with our powers combined (and the spoils of the Big Banana), that we can continue this affiliation!


2024 Upper North Shore Young Volunteer of the Year: Jiayi Fang from Turramurra.

The Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) Report





The Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) is proud to have been associated with BlowFly Cricket for the past 13 years through the provision of free coaching sessions at Mark Taylor Oval, Waitara and other venues; collaboration at a senior level on strategies to enhance All Abilities cricket; and Bruce Wood regularly volunteering at the Blowies' fund-raising BBQs at Bunnings Warehouse, Thornleigh.

BlowFly Cricket proudly celebrated its 15th Anniversary at a Gala Dinner with 150 guests at Hornsby RSL on Friday, 14 June 2024. Bruce Wood attended on behalf of the Coaches' Association.

BlowFly Cricket is a wonderful organisation led by Mark Rushton (Founder/Treasurer) and Jordan Jones (President), that provides children and adults with neurodiverse conditions and/or special needs the opportunity to play a hybrid form of All Abilities cricket, participate in entry-level coaching, and form social connections in the community. The Blowies run multiple programs throughout summer and winter in which players and volunteers engage in batting, bowling and fielding activities and social games.

BlowFly Cricket was formed in 2009 when Mark Rushton had an inspired vision that all children with special needs deserve the opportunity to enjoy cricket and improve their eye / hand co-ordination and confidence by learning new skills and interacting with other children and families in a supportive, sporting environment HKHDCCA held a free coaching session for BlowFly Cricket in the MTO Indoor Centre on 24 January 2024 (see group photo). The HKHDCCA coaches who helped the Blowies at this session were Bruce Wood and Connor Hindmarch.

A total of 25 HKHDCCA coaches have guided the Blowies at our free coaching sessions since 2011-12, including Bruce Wood, Jamie McEvoy, Connor Hindmarch, Aaron Crofts, Nick Miller, Daniel Wood, Josh Miller, Joe Hiley, Cooper Davenport, Daniel Anderson, Braden Cheng, Tom Felton, Dani Chivers, Dylan Bish, Nathan Middleton, Justin Epthorp, Will Fiedler, John Anderson, James Madden, Ryan Swain, Jack Nati, Andrew Harvey, Utkarsh Somaiya, Elysa Oliveri & Alec Silins.







The modified coaching techniques that need to be adopted have proved to be a valuable learning tool for HKHDCCA's coaches.

BlowFly Cricket continues to provide benchmark programs for its members, including the highly acclaimed "Uncoachables Coaching the Uncoachables" program. This unique all-ability program enables suitable BlowFly cricketers to attend a modified Community (Level 1) coaching course to gain a formal accreditation, which they use to coach at the Blowies' various programs, and where suitable, at the HKHDCCA school holiday cricket clinics.

This experience and exposure to an expanding number of BlowFly Cricket coaches helps them to develop increased levels of self-esteem, self-confidence and communication skills, as well as some monetary payments for their efforts. Josh Miller (Secretary, Coaches' Association) facilitated a modified Community (Level 1) accredited coaching course for BlowFly Cricket at MTO, Waitara on 12 January 2024.

The Coaches' Association has engaged some Blowfly cricketers as Assistant Coaches at the school holiday (mainstream) junior cricket clinics for the past 3 years, which have been partially funded by annual donations of \$500 from BlowFly Cricket to HKHDCCA. Akanksha Swarup, David Tanna, Ronnie MacKenzie, Bronte and Dominic Jones from BlowFly Cricket were given the opportunity to help out as Assistant Coaches at the HKHDCCA school holiday cricket clinics in 2023-24.

The Coaches' Association wishes BlowFly Cricket well on its exciting journey, which is benefiting so many children and adults with neurodiverse conditions and or special needs.
